Scott McLean has served as President of Zions Bancorporation since March 2014 and Chief Operating Officer since June 2015, having previously served as Chief Executive Officer of its Texas subsidiary, Amegy Bank. Zions Bancorporation is one of the nation's premier financial services companies, consisting of a collection of community banks in select western U.S. markets with combined total assets exceeding \$61 billion. Scott joined Amegy Bank in 2002 and continues to serve as Chairman. Amegy Bank has more than \$13 billion in assets.

Prior to joining Amegy Bank, Scott worked for JPMorgan Chase (previously Texas Commerce Bank) for 23 years, where he served in a number of roles, including President in Dallas, Chairman in El Paso and President in Houston.

Scott is a director of CenterPoint Energy, a trustee of Memorial Hermann Healthcare System and a member of the Board of Trustees of Southern Methodist University, where he has served as President of its Alumni Association and a member of the Steering Committee for both of the University's capital campaigns. His past involvement with the United Way includes Chairman of the Board, 2008-09 United Way Community Campaign Chairman and Chairman of the 2005 CEO Search Committee. In 2013, he served as Chairman of the \$7.5 million 2-1-1 Texas/United Way HELPLINE Capital Campaign. Additionally, Scott is a member of the Young Presidents Organization Gold and is a former Senior Warden of St. Martin's Episcopal Church.

While in Dallas and El Paso, Scott served in numerous civic leadership roles. Of note, he served as Chairman of the Dallas \$40 million United Way Campaign, Chairman of the Texas Business Hall of Fame Foundation, Executive Committee member and Vice Chair of Children's Medical Hospital, and a Board Member for the Presbyterian Health Care System. While in El Paso, he served as Chairman of the El Paso Chamber of Commerce and an Executive Committee member for Providence Hospital.

Scott received his Bachelor of Business Administration from Southern Methodist University and his MBA from Northwestern University J.L. Kellogg Graduate School of Management.
